Jarrett's mother is a heroin addict and father isn't in the picture. The boy, who is raised by his grandparents, is often confused about who he is and how he should conduct himself socially. He's also a talented artist who uses his art—cartooning—as a sort of therapy as he struggles to deal with the nightmares that are left in is mom's wake. The book is a graphic memoir, and the author will be at Conn College to talk with the public on September 17th. Hey, Kiddo is a heartfelt story—it's relevant, serious, funny, and sad, and it's a quick read!
